TAYLOR COUNTY HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE COLLECTION PROGRAM

The Taylor County Board of County Commissioners sponsors a Household Hazardous Waste Collection Program. A permanent collection center operates at the Environmental Services Main Office at 3750 U.S. Hwy 98 West, Perry, FL. This facility is open to the public daily from 7:30 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. The HHW Collection Program also allows residents to drop off paint, used motor oil and household chemicals at the eight solid waste collection centers (roll-off sites) during normal operating hours. The following are examples of household hazardous waste which can be disposed of at the designated sites.

The following may be placed in your regular trash:

Dried up paint (remove the lid) Empty containers (i.e. paint cans, aerosols) Carpet shampoos Sunscreen Baby oil & hand lotion Alkaline batteries Oily rags Car wax Cooking oil (soak up with paper, kitty litter or sand)

Products that would be disposed of in the sewer during normal use can be diluted and flushed down the toilet including:

Small amounts of ammonia Household cleaners (i.e. Mr. Clean, Comet, Spic-n-Span, Mop-n-Glow)
